

2021 Summer Day Camp Preparedness and Response Plan

- How you will monitor symptoms of COVID-19.
 - campers will be screened when they arrive each morning
 - questions will be asked and documented
 - Staff will also be screened when they arrive each morning
 - questions will be asked and documented
 - we will do the same thing in the middle of the day
 - if staff or camper has fever or has exhibited symptoms in last 24 hours, they will not be permitted to attend camp that day
 - We would ask them to self-isolate at home and contact their primary care physician
 - A negative COVID test, a doctor's note, or a span of 14 days must pass, in order to return to camp
 - staff will be trained on symptoms and what to look for
- How your programs practice social distancing, as developmentally appropriate.
 - we will keep groups limited to 7 campers and 1 counselor
 - keep those groups together throughout the day/week
 - limit the amount that groups mix
 - wear masks if unable to properly social distance (minimal)
 - campers belongings will be separated and kept with their group all week
- How you will ensure hygiene (including regular cleaning and disinfecting).
 - campers, staff and parents will be required to hand sanitize when they arrive each morning
 - after each use of parent signing in, pen will be wiped down/sanitized
 - equipment will be wiped down after each group's use
 - dedicated times to wash hands/hand sanitize throughout the day
 - supplies/frequently touched surfaces in the day camp building will also be wiped down at the end of camp day
- How you will obtain and use of safety equipment.
 - Purchased hand sanitizer through Fire Department
 - Maintenance staff has provided gloves, masks, disinfectant
 - Masks will be worn by staff during check-in and check-out
 - Masks will be worn when the 6 feet social distancing rule can not be followed
 - Gloves will be worn by staff at check-in and check-out
 - Hand sanitizer will be available to staff, campers and parents
- Communication and Training to staff, parents, and campers related to new expectations.
 - Camp Director will provide all communication to parents/staff regarding our covid-19 protocol, via email
 - Staff will have a 3 day training period to go over expectations and protocol
- Isolation of procedure in case of symptoms or confirmed cases onsite.

- Individual will be isolated out to the south of the sand volleyball court. Northville Township Fire Department will be called to transport camper. Camper will wear a mask, if able to.
- All other individuals will stay near the day camp building until sick camper is removed from the area. Campers will wear masks. Hand Sanitizing and hand washing will take place.
- Parents will be notified, both of sick camper and all campers
- Maybury will be notified
- Local Health Department will be notified, in which we will follow their direction
- How to maintain required staff to camper ratios in the event of staff illness.
 - will always have 4 counselors scheduled each day
 - one will be on call when they are not working, in case of illness
 - if counselor has later shift, they will be expected to come in early if another counselor calls in sick
 - if they have earlier shift, they will be expected to stay if another staff member calls in sick
 - Camp Directors will also be available to cover any shifts that might be missed
